Catechism & Scripture Memory

Q36. What do we believe about the Holy Spirit?

That he is God, coeternal with the Father and the Son.

John 14:16

And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Helper, to be with you forever.

Q37. How does the Holy Spirit help us?

The Holy Spirit convicts us of our sin, and he enables us to pray and to understand God's Word.

Ephesians 6:17

And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God.

Q38. What is prayer?

Prayer is pouring out our hearts to God.

Psalms 62:8

Trust in him at all times, O people; pour out your heart before him; God is a refuge for us.

Q39. With what attitude should we pray?

With love, perseverance, and gratefulness.

Philippians 4:6

Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God.

Q40. What should we pray?

The whole Word of God directs us in what we should pray.

Ephesians 3:14-17

For this reason I bow my knees before the Father, from whom every family in heaven and on earth is named, that according to the riches of his glory he may grant you to be strengthened with power through his Spirit in your inner being, so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith.

Q41. What is the Lord's Prayer?

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

Matthew 6:9

Pray then like this: "Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name."

Q42. How is the Word of God to be read and heard?

With diligence, preparation, and prayer; so that we may accept it with faith and practice it in our lives.

2 Timothy 3:16

All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness.

Q43. What are the sacraments or ordinances?

Baptism and the Lord's Supper.

Luke 22:19-20

And he took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to them, saying, "This is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." And likewise the cup after they had eaten, saying, "This cup that is poured out for you is the new covenant in my blood."

Romans 6:4

We were buried therefore with him by the baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life.

Q44. What is baptism?

Baptism is the washing with water in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

Matthew 28:19

Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Q45. Is baptism with water the washing away of sin itself?

No, only the blood of Christ can cleanse us from sin.

Luke 3:16

John answered them all, saying, "I baptize you with water, but he who is mightier than I is coming, the strap of whose sandals I am not worthy to untie. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire.

Q46. What is the Lord's Supper?

Christ commanded all Christians to eat bread and to drink from the cup in thankful remembrance of him.

1 Corinthians 11:24-26

And when he had given thanks, he broke it, and said, "This is my body which is for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way also he took the cup, after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

Q47. Does the Lord's Supper add anything to Christ's atoning work?

No, Christ died once for all.

1 Peter 3:18

For Christ also suffered once for sins, the righteous for the unrighteous, that he might bring us to God.

Q48. What is the church?

A community elected for eternal life and united by faith, who love, follow, learn from, and worship God together.

2 Thessalonians 2:13

But we ought always to give thanks to God for you, brothers beloved by the Lord, because God chose you as the firstfruits to be saved, through sanctification by the Spirit and belief in the truth.

Q49. Where is Christ now?

Christ rose bodily from the grave on the third day after his death and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

Ephesians 1:20

He raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places.

Q50. What does Christ's resurrection mean for us?

Christ triumphed over sin and death so that all who trust in him are raised to new life in this world and to everlasting life in the world to come

1 Thessalonians 4:14

For since we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so, through Jesus, God will bring with him those who have fallen asleep.

Q51. Of what advantage to us is Christ's ascension?

Christ is now advocating for us in the presence of his Father and also sends us his Spirit.

Romans 8:34

Who is to condemn? Christ Jesus is the one who died – more than that, who was raised – who is at the right hand of God, who indeed is interceding for us.

Q52. What hope does everlasting life hold for us?

That we will live with and enjoy God forever in the new heaven and the new earth, where we will be forever freed from all sin in a renewed, restored creation.

Revelation 21:3

And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Behold, the dwelling place of God is with man, He will dwell with them, and they will be his people, and God himself will be with them as their God."

Q1. What is our only hope in life and death?

That we are not our own but belong to God.

Romans 14:8

I live, we live to the Lord, and if we die, we die to the Lord. So then, whether we live or whether we die, we are the Lord's.

Q2. What is God?

God is the creator of everyone and everything.

Psalm 86:10

For you are great and do wondrous things; you alone are God.

Q3. How many persons are there in God?

There are three persons in one God: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

2 Corinthians 13:14

The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

Q4. How and why did God create us?

God created us male and female in his own image to glorify him.

Genesis 1:27

So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them.

Q5. What else did God create?

God created all things, and all his creation was very good.

Genesis 1:31

And God saw everything that he had made and behold, it was very good.

Q6. How can we glorify God?

By loving him and by obeying his commands and law.

Deuteronomy 11:1

You shall therefore love the LORD your God and keep his charge, his statutes, his rules, and his commandments always.

Q7. What does the law of God require?

That we love God with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength; and love our neighbors as ourselves.

Matthew 22:40

On these two commandments depend all the Law and the Prophets.
